Colorado State University is an equal opportunity/affirmative action institution and complies with all Federal and Colorado State laws, regulations, and executive orders regarding affirmative action requirements in all programs. Continuing Colorado State Students

Students currently enrolled in degree programs at Colorado State University register for Summer Session courses according to the registration procedures listed on pages 17-18.

Summer-Only Students

Students attending Summer Session, who do not plan to complete a degree at Colorado State, are classified as summer-only students. Summer-only students wishing to register for courses listed in the Summer Session Class Schedule must first complete an Application for Summer Session form (pages 13 and 14) and obtain their personal access code (PAC) and submit their e-mail address at <http://eid.colostate.edu> in order to complete the on-line registration process for these courses. The registration process is described on pages 15-20. Summer-only students may complete the Summer Application on-line at www.summer.colostate.edu.

Completion of the Application for Summer Session does not require submission of transcripts or payment of application fee. While admission to Summer Session does not constitute admission to the University for fall or spring semesters, credits earned by summer-only students during Summer Session may count toward a Colorado State degree after regular admission is granted. In addition, Colorado State is fully accredited and credits earned are transferable to other academic institutions of higher education.

E-mail Address Requirement

In order to communicate quickly and effectively with students, the University now requires that each enrolled student provide an e-mail address in addition to a postal mailing address. Students may use the e-mail service of their choice or the free e-mail service the University provides. **Registration HOLDS are placed on students who fail to provide an e-mail address.**

Being able to communicate electronically with students provides several benefits:

1. Students can be quickly notified by professors and University offices of events that affect them personally or may be of interest to them generally (e.g., classroom changes, class meeting time changes, department activities, etc.).
2. It's faster and less costly than printing and mailing letters.
3. It advances the University's commitment to environmental consciousness by reducing paper use and eliminating physical refuse.

Tuition, Fees, and Other Expenses

"In-State Residency" for Tuition Classification Purposes

Classification of students for tuition purposes is governed by state statute ("tuition law") which sets forth conditions for a student being considered as "in-state" for purposes of tuition classification. The tuition law is contained in Sections 23-7-101 to 104, and 23-7-105 of the Colorado Revised Statutes. Although individuals may be considered state residents for voting and other legal purposes after being in the state for a short period of time, the tuition law specifies additional requirements for classification as "in-state" for tuition

purposes. The tuition law, which applies to all public institutions of higher education in Colorado, is subject to judicial interpretation and change at any time by the Colorado Legislature. Colorado State University must apply the rules set forth in the Residency Statute, and is *not* free to make exceptions except as specifically permitted under the Statute.

Definition of "In-State Residency" for Tuition Purposes

Under the Colorado tuition law, the term "in-state" student means: "A student who has been domiciled in Colorado for one year or more immediately preceding the first day of classes (the first day of the **eight-week session for the summer term only**) for the term for which such status is claimed." Further, the tuition law states: "Attendance at an institution of higher education, public or private, within the state of Colorado shall not alone be sufficient to qualify for domicile in Colorado."

"Domicile" is the legal term used to describe the place where a person has chosen to make a fixed and permanent home. A domicile includes physical presence and intent, and must be established for 12 months on or prior to the first day of classes. You can only establish domicile in Colorado if you intend to reside permanently in the state, and meet the definition of a "Qualified Student." A copy of the tuition law 23-7-101 to 104 and 23-7-105 of the Colorado Revised Statutes is available at Student Financial Services, 103 Administration Annex, or on our Web site at <http://sfs.colostate.edu/>.

Military Personnel and Dependents. Active duty members of the armed forces of the United States and Canada on permanent duty stationed in Colorado and their dependents (as defined by military regulations) are eligible for in-state status, regardless of domicile or length of residence in Colorado. The military member must have reported to a duty station in the state, as certified by the military command, not later than the first day of class of the applicable academic term. It is the responsibility of active duty members of the military or their dependents to notify the University to initiate and maintain this status.

International Students. Non-United States citizens may, under HB96-1083, be eligible to establish "domicile" for classification as an in-state student for tuition purposes. Contact the Tuition Classification Office to determine your eligibility.

Initial Classification

Your initial tuition classification is determined from the information you supply on your application for admission to the University or in the case of "summer-only students" (page 15), the Application for Summer Session (page 13). The University, when making this determination, may also consider relevant information contained in any other University education records. Failure to answer all questions on the admissions application could lead to initial classification as "nonresident."

Petition for Classification Review

Newly admitted or currently enrolled students who are initially classified as "nonresident" but feel they meet the requirements for in-state residency status may file a petition for re-classification with the Tuition Classification Officer located in the Student Financial Services Office. **Petitioners should consider their tuition classification status that of a nonresident until their classification is changed, and personal financial decisions should be made accordingly.** Petition materials and a copy of the Colorado Revised Statutes can be obtained from the Student Financial Services, 103 Administration Annex. Petitions will be processed only if the student has been admitted to the University, or is currently enrolled for the semester they are requesting a change in classification.

Deadline to Petition

The **deadline** to submit a petition for the Summer 2006 semester is **May 12, 2006**. Petitions submitted after the semester deadline will require approval from the Student Financial Services Tuition Classification Officer. For more information regarding the petition process or deadline dates for future semesters visit www.sfs.colostate.edu or contact Student Financial Services, (970) 491-6321.

Appeal of Classification

Decisions made by the Tuition Classification Officer are subject to appeal to the Residency Appeals Committee. The appeal must be submitted in writing, no later than 15 days after the date of the letter in which the decision is conveyed to the petitioner. The decision of the Residency Appeals Committee is the final administrative ruling; however, petitioners may seek legal counsel to be informed of their rights and remedies. Additional information regarding the appeal process is available through Student Financial Services, 103 Administration Annex.

Any student who provides false information to avoid paying “nonresident” tuition may be subject to legal and/or disciplinary action.

Tuition and Fee Authority

The Board of Governors sets tuition consistent with tuition and fee policies established by the Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCH) and the Joint Budget Committee. Tuition is set for the year at the June Board of Governors meeting.

For undergraduate and graduate tuition and fees, please go to the summer session website at www.summer.colostate.edu.

Note: The schedule of tuition and fees does not apply to courses offered through the Division of Continuing Education which are assessed separately.

* The collected fees are assigned to Legal Services, Sports Recreation, Conflict Resolution, Student Conduct Services, Board of Student Communications, Community Services, ASCSU, Student Recreation Center, Lory Student Center, Health Services, and Transport.

** A mandatory separate University Technology Fee will be assessed to ALL students each term.

By completing the registration process, the student agrees to pay the University according to the payment schedule above and further agrees to pay late charges and other specified penalties.

University charges are due on the date specified on your statement. A late charge of 1.5 percent per month will be assessed on any amounts not paid by the due date.

Student Account Billing Statements are mailed to the billing address, if one has been provided to the University. Otherwise, student account billing statements are mailed to the mailing address on file with the University. The University will not register a student, confer a degree, or provide a final transcript to any student or former student who has a past due financial obligation to the University.

Returned Checks

Any person who presents to the University a check, either paper or electronic, that is not accepted for payment by the bank because of insufficient funds, stopped payment, nonexistent account, or other reason for which the person is responsible is charged a penalty as provided by state law. The Records and Registration Office assists the Department of Veterans Affairs by providing certification for VA educational benefits. Students eligible for benefits should contact the Records and Registration Office at least six weeks prior to the expected date of enrollment. Before requesting veteran’s educational benefits, applicants should already have applied to Colorado State University in a degree-seeking program, for teacher licensure or for selected certificate programs offered through the University’s Division of Continuing Education (DCE). Minimum acceptable credit loads for students enrolled for summer session terms can be obtained by contacting the Records and Registration Office.

Late Registration

A \$50 charge may be assessed to students allowed to register late or for late adds after the registration period.

Tuition and Fees Adjustments

An adjustment of tuition and fees is allowed during the schedule change period of each term. See the registration changes by subterm and section and deadline dates of each term. After this deadline, there is no adjustment in tuition or fees should a course be dropped.

Nonrefundable Charges

- Research charges: Graduate students may be responsible for all or a portion of their thesis/dissertation research. This expense is highly variable depending on the discipline, the research topic, and the availability of support from funded projects, sponsored programs, or academic departments.

2006 Summer Session students are considered for two types of financial aid:

- Federal Pell Grant
- Federal Direct Loans
 - Federal Direct Loans (subsidized and unsubsidized)
 - Federal Direct Parent Loan for Dependent Students (PLUS)

Cost

Cost of attendance for financial aid will be determined by the length of the session and the number of credits.

Eligibility

To be considered for the Pell Grant and/or Direct Loans, students must:

1. Complete the 2005-2006 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible. The processor must receive the application by June 30, 2006. The FAFSA for the 2005-2006 academic school year will be used for the 2006 summer session. If you have already completed the FAFSA for this year, do not submit another.
2. Complete Colorado State University's Financial Aid Application for Summer 2006 (available on RAMweb at www.ramweb.colostate.edu in early April). The deadline to submit the summer application is July 1.
3. Be accepted for summer and enrolled in an approved degree/certificate program.
4. Enroll for a minimum of 6 Summer Session credits; 5 credits for graduate students.
5. Have remaining eligibility for Pell Grant or Direct Loans.
6. Be making satisfactory academic progress when your summer financial aid application is processed and at the time funds are credited to your university student account.

Students who are not eligible for Pell Grant and/or Direct Loans may want to consider an alternative loan. Information on alternative loans is available from Student Financial Services. Students interested in alternative loans are required to complete Colorado State University's Financial Aid Application for Summer 2006 (see #2 above).

Registration Procedures

Registration and schedule changes (adds and drops) for courses listed in the Summer Session Class Schedule are accomplished on-line by selecting the Registration link in RAMweb. To access RAMweb, use the following Web address: <http://ramweb.colostate.edu>. In order to fully benefit from the system, it is essential that you follow the required procedures and conform to the established deadlines. Preparation prior to registration minimizes mistakes and time on the system, thereby reducing the demand during peak registration periods.

Only one registration for the Summer Session is needed, and adjustments of the original registration are made through the schedule change and drop procedure.

Questions regarding any of the following information, except as otherwise noted, should be directed to the Records and Registration Office (491-7148), located in the Administration Annex, Room 100. Office hours during Summer Session are 7:30 am-4:30 pm (MTW and F) and 9:00 am-4:30 pm (Thursday).

Electronic Identity (eID)

Access to your academic records requires the use of an electronic identity (eID). If you have not yet created an eID, go to <http://eid.colostate.edu> and click on "Get or verify your eID and provide your e-mail address." This process will require your PID (usually your Social Security number) and your PAC (personal access code). Your eID (eName and ePassword) is required for access to the registration system. It provides security to your registration record, so do not share it with others. If your ePassword is ever compromised, you may use the "I forgot my ePassword" link on RAMweb, answer the questions you selected, and then change your ePassword. New students for summer receive their PACs by mail after completing and submitting the 2006 Summer Session Application. Students who complete the on-line summer application can receive their PACs through an on-line secure site.

Registration System Operating Hours

The registration system operates during the following times:

All of these times are subject to change due to demands on the system or equipment availability.

Preparing for Registration

Continuing Colorado State students should contact their adviser for assistance in selection of courses. If you do not know who your adviser is, contact the department of your major for assistance. University Open Option students should contact the Center for Advising and Student Achievement (CASA); College Open Option students should contact their college dean's office. Advising is not required for summer-only students.

Registration Procedure

Before accessing the registration system:

- Complete the Registration Worksheet (pg. 20);
- Have your 2006 *Summer Class Schedule* and writing materials available as you begin your access;
- Know your options for courses/sections before you begin.

If you lack this necessary information while you are registering, you can exit the system and reenter when you are ready. Some departments place class or major restrictions on courses or sections of courses. These restrictions are listed with each course. Some of these restrictions may be temporary until certain classes or majors have had an opportunity to register for the course or section involved. If this is the case, all students may have access to them after the date noted in the course listing. Exceptions to these restrictions may be made only by the academic department offering the course.

When you are denied enrollment in a course, the reason is given. Reasons could include: class is filled; ineligible because of class or major restriction; time conflict with another course; etc. You may be eligible for another section of the same course, and you can request a list of open sections.

You may also reenter the system to add another course, drop a course for which you registered previously, or change credits in a variable credit course for which you are registered. You are urged to do this early, as the use of the registration system increases as the first day of classes nears.

Registration Information (RI)

No written confirmation of your registration selections will be mailed to you. However, you may log-on to RAMweb at any time to view or print your selection of courses.

Photo ID Cards

Students can obtain University ID cards between 7:45 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday at the University ID/Vending Office in the Lory Student Center; Student Recreation Center; or at the Palmer Center (Housing and Food Services Office). You must bring in a government-issued picture ID, i.e., driver's license, military, or passport. Your photo will be taken and an ID will be issued immediately. Residence hall students should go to the Palmer Center for their ID cards. Please call (970) 491-2344 if you have any questions.

Schedule Change Period

Schedule changes are made on the registration system during authorized periods. Courses can normally be added, sections changed within a course, and credits changed in a variable credit course during the schedule change period (see Registration Changes by subterm in right-hand column).

Some courses restrict such adjustments to the special schedule change period. This is noted in the course listings. Courses may be dropped through the schedule change period without a W (withdrawal) entry on the student's academic record, and tuition and fees will be adjusted accordingly.

Students who fail to attend either of the first two class meetings, or the first meeting of a class that meets once a week, are responsible to see that the course is officially dropped, or they are subject to grades and tuition and fees for the course. Nonattendance does not constitute dropping or withdrawal.

Fee Adjustments for Schedule Changes

An adjustment of tuition and fees is allowed during the schedule change period. After this deadline, there is no adjustment in tuition and fees should the student drop a course.

Holds

Academic and administrative offices can place holds on your registration in order to prevent access to the registration system. Holds are placed for a variety of reasons (academic, financial). Failure to meet a payment deadline results in a financial hold which prevents adds for a student who is registered. Each hold and the office involved (including office relations) is listed by the registration system. You must clear each hold with the office involved. Once you have cleared the hold, the office deletes the hold from the registration system. Please clear your holds before you attempt to register.

If a hold is placed on your registration after you have registered, your registration is not cancelled. However, you will not have registration access to add courses or to register for subsequent terms until the hold is cleared. Students with holds may drop courses by using the registration system. Holds do not extend other deadlines. Students who fail to provide an e-mail address to the University are subject to a registration hold. See "E-mail Address Requirement" on page 15 for details.

Students new to Colorado State University registering for 2006 Summer Session and born on or after January 1, 1957 must submit written documentation of immunization to Hartshorn Health Service. See Immunization Requirement.

How to Register

The following information is intended to assist you in registering for 2005 Summer Session.

Instructions

Read these procedures before accessing the registration system.

Adviser

Advising is not required for Summer Session. However, it is recommended for those who can take advantage of it.

Personal Access Codes (PACs)

A permanent personal access code (PAC) has been assigned to you for this and future terms of enrollment. Record it where you can find it whenever you need to register or change your schedule. Do not disclose it to others, so your registration will remain secure.

HOLDS

HOLDS (financial, scholastic, etc.) may be placed on your registration by academic or administrative offices which prevent your use of the registration system. Contact the offices involved to clear these before any deadlines.

RAM web

To register on-line via RAMweb, use the following Web address: <http://ramweb.colostate.edu>. In RAMweb, select the "Registration" link.

You may re-enter the system to change or add to your previous requests. On-screen instructions will guide you in each situation. Note the times that the registration is available each day.

Student Option Pass/Fail or Audit Grading

If you wish to select pass/fail grading for a student option pass/fail graded course or audit grading, complete the form, obtain the necessary approval signatures, and submit the form to the Records and Registration Office, 100 Administration Annex, on or before the authorized last day to add the course. This must be done after you register for the course in question.

Address

Your address is essential for registration and other University activities. You are responsible for maintaining a mailing address, even during the summer. To change your mailing or billing address, access RAMweb. If you have any questions, contact the Records and Registration Office in 100 Administration Annex, or call (970) 491-7148.

Variable Credits

Requests for courses offered for variable credit (course suffix ends with "V") initiate a registration system request for the number of credits for which you wish to register. Enter the desired number of credits.

Maximum Credit Loads

The registration system does not accept registrations for a credit overload. Maximum credit load (all terms combined) for undergraduate students is 18; maximum credit load for graduate students is 15.

A Credit Overload Authority form is included in the University Class Schedule (p. 21). When completed, return it to Records and Registration Office, 100 Administration Annex, on or before the last day to add the class which causes the overload.

Tuition and Fees

A statement reflecting assessed tuition and fees is mailed to you as a result of your registration. Payment deadlines are included and late payment penalties assessed for late payment. Registrations are not cancelled as a result of late or nonpayment.

Cancellation/Withdrawal

7. The first time each term you access the registration system you will be requested to provide information regarding Marital Status, Expected Term and Year of Graduation. For “*Summer Only Students*” please select *Summer* and enter 05 as your Expected Term and Year of Graduation.
8. Registration Menu
 - a. Select *Add a Course*. Then click on *Submit Information Button* **once**.
 - b. Enter the 6 digit SectionID number. Then click on *Submit Information Button* **once**. Courses are being added to your schedule each time you click the *Submit Information Button*.
 - c. Keep adding courses until complete.
